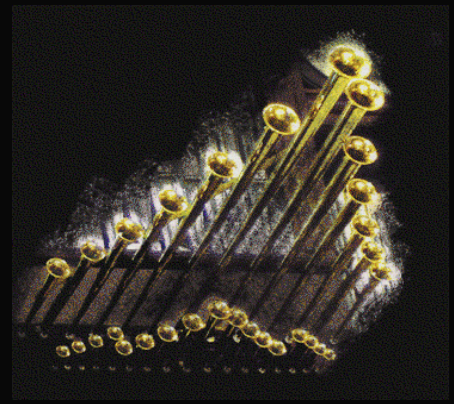

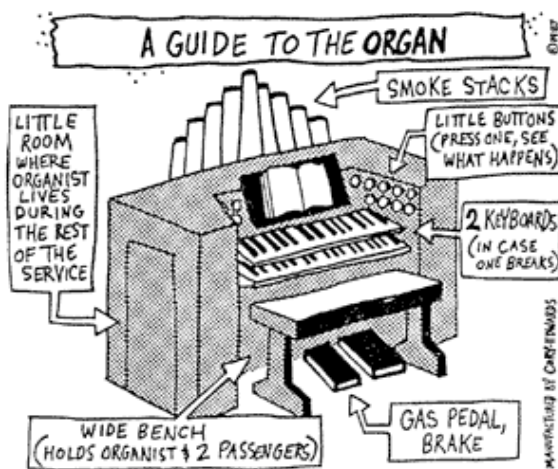

### *Dean's recommended websites*

1. The Dean recommends a new online store for purchasing organ CDs. After 9 years at ZAREX.COM, the Pro Organo internet store has moved to its own new site: [PROORGANO.COM](http://PROORGANO.COM). The new site offers USA buyers reduced shipping costs as an option. User names and passwords are not required.
2. The Fratelli Ruffatti website was originally created in 1997 with twelve pages of information. A lot has changed in the past twelve years, and the site has gradually changed and evolved through four webmasters. Recently they have posted more information about the company and the way they build organs. With a total of 58 pages, some of them lengthy, it is one of the largest and most informative of all organbuilder websites. In addition to detailed explanations, the new website shows 115 graphics of their organ building and restoration processes.
